We have the double whammy of living through the excessive intrusive weeds growing in our shallow basin and living predominantly downwind of all the floating cuttings from the CLA harvesting northwest of us. I have attached a couple of photos showing you our conditions. We have had to hire private contractors to come in and haul out the foul-smelling accumulation of weeds. I am a fan of the scientific backed approach recently revived by CLP and tired of the same old approach since mid-80s of CLA. I have been around long enough to understand the political environment and the clout of the Institution. I am dismayed to hear that your approach to compromise and working together is establishing a demarcation line at Long Point and prevent a proven scientific approach to be used north of Long Point.
