Chautauqua Lake, A Great Lake Seeking a Greater Future Bemus Bay Property Owners (BBPO)

- Problem: unacceptable Chautauqua Lake water quality in Bemus Bay
 - Accumulation of weeds and algae near shore and on the shoreline
 - Rotten weeds form a near shore and shoreline foul-smelling "sludge"/a stench









- "Sludge" facilitates growth of blue-green algae with cyanobacteria/toxins
- Unhealthy and life-threatening situation for humans, pets and other animals
- Wading, swimming, kayaking, fishing, entertainment, etc are impossible
- Already having a negative impact on tourism/business and property values
- Goal: eliminate floating, near shore and shoreline weeds and sludge
- Solution: local government leadership with property owner action
 - County, Town of Ellery and Village of Bemus Point leadership and expertise
 - Bemus Bay Property Owners (BBPO) group objectives, assistance and support

Chautauqua Lake, A Great Lake Seeking a Greater Future Bemus Bay Property Owners (BBPO)

- Weed cutting, the only method used since 2002, isn't doing the job
 - In a 2014 survey of lake residents: 83% said the lake was deteriorating and only 8% favored weed cutting for weed management (18% favored herbicides)
 - At least 10% of the weeds cut (1.4M lbs in 2016) aren't recovered and end up floating on the lake, near shore, on shorelines and/or on the lake bottom
 - Weed cutting-related damages to property owners are not mitigated
- BBPO (40 and growing) committed to completion of 5 objectives for 2017
 - Complete the County's MMS with property owner input and participation
 - Gain state and local government support for BBPO efforts
 - Get the Chautauqua Lake Association (CLA) to upgrade its operations: (1) transparency in prioritization, (2) mitigation of negative impacts, and, (3) seriously consider other management methods including use of herbicides
- Secure a NYS DEC permit for herbicide application and apply herbicides
- Secure a US ACOE permit for dredging of weeds and sludge and dredge

Chautauqua Lake, A Great Lake Seeking a Greater Future Town of Ellery and Village of Bemus Leadership

- Significant Bemus Bay shoreline property values are being threatened
 - Shoreline land assessed at \$2800/shoreline ft (x 11,035 ft of shoreline=\$31M)
 - Home/building improvements and non-lakeside land assessments additional
 - Town- and school district-billed taxes as well as sales and bed taxes at risk
 - Recent sales show lakeside assessments 15-20% in excess of sale prices
 - Bemus Bay improvement in the interest of County, Town and Village
- BBPO seeking significant Town and Village roles meeting its objectives
 - Provide an Ellery Town Council member as point contact for BBPO
 - Be the "applicants" for Bemus Bay herbicide and dredging permits
 - Participate in <u>BBPO/Ellery/Ellicott Town Clerk meeting</u> the week of January 16 +Plan Town of Ellicott herbicide (2002-3) and dredging applications (recent) as models
 - Participate in NYS DEC pre-application meeting the week of January 23
 +Facilitate interactions with NYS DEC and US ACOE through permit approval
 - Leverage Town and Village influence/funding to get upgrade of CLA operations
 - 2017 Bemus Bay success would likely be imitated by of Chautauqua towns and villages and support Chautauqua Lake, A Great Lake Seeking a Greater Future
